The World Health Organisation has declared 2020 as the Year of the Nurse and Midwife to celebrate the 200th birthday of Florence Nightingale. To celebrate *Nursing Now* has partnered with the World Health Organisation to launch the [Nightingale Challenge](#)

The Nightingale Challenge is an integral part of Nursing Now's aim to improve health globally by raising the profile and status of nurses and midwives. To achieve this every health employer from around the world has been asked to provide leadership and development training for a group of their young nurses and midwives during 2020.

The aim is to have at least 20,000 nurses and midwives aged 35 and under benefiting from this initiative with at least 1,000 organisations taking part from around the world.

The Office of the Chief Nurse and Midwife is providing an opportunity for nurses and midwives currently working in Tasmania aged 35 years and under to participate in the Nightingale Challenge. Places are limited and successful participants must participate in all components.
