



IMPORTANT: COVID-19 Update – Restrictions for aged care employees who have visited Melbourne

As you will be aware, the Coronavirus (COVID-19) situation in Victoria is evolving. Rates of community transmission are increasing, particularly in Melbourne.

Today, the ACT Health Minister, Rachel Stephen-Smith, advised aged care providers in the Territory that due to increased risk of infection in Victoria, any person who has visited Melbourne in the past 14 days should not be permitted to enter an aged care facility in Canberra. In light of this advice, Calvary has taken the decision to introduce new safety measures at Calvary Haydon Retirement Community.

Effective immediately, any Calvary Haydon Retirement Community staff member who has travelled to or from Melbourne in the past 14 days is currently not permitted to attend the workplace.

- **For employees who have visited Melbourne within the last 14 days from 26 June 2020, you will be required to take special Coronavirus leave and monitor your health for 14 days.** If you are showing or develop any symptoms of COVID-19, please seek further medical advice.
- **For employees who choose to travel to Melbourne from 26 June 2020, you will be required to use the leave type personal and carers leave.** Where paid personal and carers leave is not available, the period will be unpaid leave.
