Project Announcement

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, all Calvary facilities are required to track and monitor the health status of all entrants. The screening of all entrants across Calvary is currently a manual activity and generally managed by a combination of clinical and non-clinical staff.

As a result, Calvary have commenced the trial of an automated entrant screening solution to replace this manual process. Calvary Launceston are included in this trial.

Project Purpose

The aim of the Safe Entry project is to streamline the entrant screening process and management of visitors, whilst maintaining the required entrant standards relating to COVID-19.

This pilot project aims to review the suitability of an entrant screening solution provided by [Zipline](#) for Calvary hospitals and residential aged care facilities and determine if this is the most appropriate solution for all Calvary sites.

Project Timeline

The trial will commence on 30 November 2020 at which time all entrants will begin using the screening stations.

Screening stations will be positioned at the front entrance points of St Luke's and St Vincent's Hospitals with all entrants required to use these stations, including employees, doctors, contractors, visitors and patients.

The trial will be evaluated over a three-week period at which point it will be determined if this screening solution is appropriate for Calvary and next steps communicated.

All staff will have an opportunity to participate in this review process and provide feedback.

Process Overview

Visitors and Patients

Entrants will be required to present to a screening station upon entry to either St Luke's or St Vincent's Hospitals.

The screening station will check the temperature of the entrant and ask a series of COVID-19 related questions.

Once cleared by the screening station the entrant can proceed to Reception for a screening confirmation sticker before moving to their destination. Visitors will also be required to proceed to the Ward Clerk to ensure visitation rules are being followed.

Staff, Doctors and Contractors

Entrants will be required to present to a screening station upon entry to either St Luke's or St Vincent's Hospitals.

The screening station will check the temperature of the entrant and ask a series of COVID-19 related questions.

Once cleared staff and doctors can proceed to their place of work.

Once cleared contractors can proceed to the place of registration.

The screening station will recognise employees by their mobile phone number. To prepare for the introduction of these screening stations I ask that you log into your [MyKiosk](#) account and ensure your mobile number is accurate.
