Dear Resident or Family Member,

RE: Updated Visitor Restrictions - Calvary Retirement Communities Hunter Manning Area

While the COVID-19 situation in Sydney continues to stabilise, both Western Australia and Victoria have identified new cases of COVID-19 in the community.

Today, NSW Health advised that visitors who have been in [Victorian venues of concern](#) or Western Australian locations visited by confirmed cases should not be permitted entry into NSW aged care facilities.

What does this mean for residents and families?

Consistent with the latest NSW Health advice, Calvary Hunter Manning Retirement Communities will align restrictions on visitation. The following restrictions will change from today, 4 February 2021:

- Visitors who have been to any [Victorian venues of concern](#) since 29 January 2021 are currently not permitted entry.
- Visitors who have been to any [WA Locations visited by confirmed cases](#) or the [Perth, Peel or South West Regions of WA](#) since 25 January 2021 are currently not permitted entry.
- Visitors who have been to any [contact tracing locations of interest](#) in New Zealand are currently not permitted entry.

Please note that all other restrictions on visitation, last advised in our email of 2 February 2021, are current and will remain in place until further notice.

The situation in Victoria and WA is expected to evolve over the coming days and weeks. We anticipate NSW Health will advise further changes to restrictions and we will adjust our restrictions accordingly.
