Dear Resident or Family Member,

RE: COVID-19 Vaccination Day at Calvary St Francis Retirement Community

I am writing to inform you that NSW Health has confirmed with Calvary St Francis Retirement Community that the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine will be administered to consenting residents on Tuesday, 23 March 2021.

This is an exciting occasion for residents. We are pleased to be able to offer the COVID-19 vaccination to residents and strongly encourage resident participation. Vaccination is a safe, effective and cost-free way to protect ongoing health and wellbeing in the pandemic environment.

What to expect on Vaccination Day

Vaccination day will be Tuesday, 23 March 2021. In cooperation with NSW Health, a dedicated team of credentialed vaccinators will be coming on site to administer the vaccination and monitor for any side effects.

- Calvary staff will be on hand to assist residents on the day to receive their vaccinations.
- Vaccinations will be provided in a dedicated location on site, or provided to residents in their rooms as individually required.
- Staff will check resident health to make sure it is suitable for them to receive the vaccine.
- Residents will be closely monitored for any side effects following vaccination.
- If the facility has any concerns about resident health we will consult the resident's usual doctor.

You can also choose to talk to your doctor at any time about your health and COVID-19 vaccination - the benefits and potential side effects, specific to you.

Resident Consent Required

As communicated previously, resident consent will be required before the vaccine is administered. The vaccine will not be administered to any residents who have not consented to receive the vaccine. **If you wish to receive the vaccination and have not provided your consent, please fill in the [Department of Health COVID-19 Vaccination Consent Form](#) and return to:**

We will do all we can to facilitate your involvement on the day, but please be aware that logistics for the day will be challenging.
